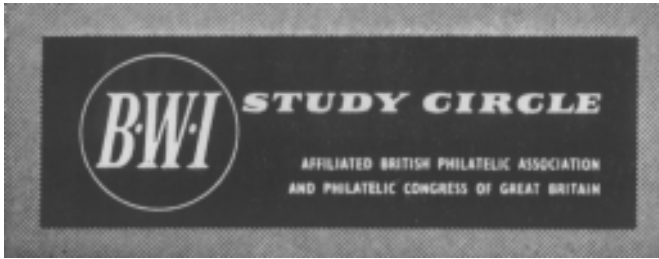

All the examples in my collection and the many I have seen elsewhere show the 'G' and there is no record of an example with 'Collection' spelt correctly with a 'C.'

**Unrecorded Variety.** In response to Mr. A. H. Johnson's query in Bulletin No. 26, page 50, Messrs. L. P. Voller, Howard J. Gaston and H. B. Macmillan have been good enough to forward information regarding this variety. It would seem that the "pipe" varies in length and can be generally sorted into short and long exhausts pipes. It appears to be constant and can be found on the first stamp of the bottom row, left hand corner of the sheet.

## LEEWARD ISLANDS

Mr. E. V. Toeg is quite right when he corrects me for saying that "duplex" stamps were used in effect all the islands of the Leeward group - I should have said "killers". The only true duplex stamps would seem to be those used in Nevis but in conjunction with a c.d.s. though not a duplex. In St. Kitts the A12 killer is used with c.d.s. St. Kitts CA (Cayon), St. Kitts DB (Dieppe Bay) and probably St. Kitts OR (Old Road).

# MONTSERRAT

**Crowned Circle Marks.** I recently submitted to our Secretary, for an opinion, a cover of 1884 from Montserrat to St. Kitts. This cover bears on the front the following marks:-

- 1) 'Paid at Montserrat' crowned circle in red.
- 2) St. Kitts single ring receiving mark of 1st January 1884.
- 3) Letter 'R' in oval (registration mark) with manuscript figures 694.

This cover was forwarded to Major Adrian E. Hopkins, who confirmed that the handstamps appeared to be genuine, but in spite of this considered the cover basically wrong. Can any member supply further information on such a late use (1884) of a crowned circle mark in this Colony, where stamps had been in use since 1876 ?

# TRINIDAD

## II. Registration Envelopes

Sizes: F 5¼" x 3¼", G 6" x 3¾"; K 11½" x 6".

**1. 1880** - printed by McCorquodale. Without value expressed and without name of colony. Inscription on obverse in blue, and on the flap an arched panel with FOR REGISTRATION ONLY in block letters in plain relief on a green ground.

No value expressed: green and blue: sizes F, G, K.

**2. 18th June, 1884** - regular issue printed by McCorquodale, with embossed stamp on the flap.

2d. grey-blue to blue; sizes F, G.

Both sizes (in a grey-blue shade) exist with the embossed stamp overprinted with small serified SPECIMEN in black, 11¼ mm. long.

Note: the McCorquodale imprint varies slightly in style.

**3. 1890 or earlier** - as last, but printed by De La Rue. Slightly different in shape, the main characteristic being that the flap now has a rounded tongue.

2d. grey-blue: sizes F, G.

**4. 1890** - local modification to last issue. A line of perforations was rim across the right-hand side through the flap and the two thicknesses of the envelope.

The perforation gauges 11¼. There was an additional inscription on the back and the flap was overprinted TO WITHDRAW CONTENTS CUT AWAY PER-FORATED PORTION OF ENVELOPE in thick block capitals in red, two lines.

2d. grey-blue to blue; sizes F, G.

**5. ?1893** - as last, but with a red line in place of the perforations and with the overprint on the flap now reading TO WITHDRAW CONTENTS CUT ENVELOPE / ACROSS RED LINE, again in thick block capitals in red, in two lines.

2d. grey-blue to blue; sizes F, G.

Variety: with line of perforations in addition to red line; size G.

**6. 1895** - new type with the embossed flap now folding over on to the address side of the envelope.

2d. grey-blue to blue; sizes F, G.

**7. 1902** - design as last, but with head of K.E. VII.

2d. dark blue; sizes F, G.

Size F, and, no doubt, size G also, exists overprinted SPECIMEN as for the Edwardian Postcards.

### III. Wrappers

**1. 18th June, 1884** - regular issue designed and printed by De La Rue on buff wove paper 12" x 5", gummed and tapered at the upper end.

½d. green.

1d. carmine.

**2. ?11th February, 1885** - provisional issue. The 1d wrapper of the previous issue surcharged in black HALFPENNY, 14½ mm. long in block letters, and with four (or five) horizontal lines across the original value.

½d. black surcharge on 1d. carmine.

Variety: with five horizontal lines across the original value.

Note: I have seen examples with HALFPENNY measuring 17½ mm. in length which were apparently forgeries, though I do not as yet entirely rule out the possibility of genuine examples existing with this 17½ mm. surcharge.

**3. 1902-04** - as before but with head of K.E. VII.

½d. green (1902).

1d. carmine (1904).

Both exist overprinted SPECIMEN as for the Edwardian Postcards.

Confirmation of the dates of issue, where uncertain, and any further information would be much appreciated.

## **REVIEW**

### **"The Road to Philately."\***

Numerous books have been written to aid the beginner and new collector - all excellent in themselves - but here is a new work with an entirely different approach. It can be best described as a progressive course in elementary philately, designed to bridge the gap between the philatelic primer and advanced specialist works. Remarkably comprehensive, it is well written in a style and method hitherto unattempted on this very wide subject and will prove invaluable to stamp collectors who have already made a good beginning, - in fact, it will be of interest to all collectors. Wherever possible the catalogue numbers of both Gibbons and Scotts have been included and applied to the majority of different stamps mentioned throughout the book. Philatelic terms and expressions are fully explained in well defined appendices.
